#### **WELCOME TO EASTER SEASON!**

There are seven Sundays of Easter; this Sunday will be the third. The Church prolongs the celebration of Easter for seven Sundays because the resurrection of Christ is so powerful it is impossible to confine the wonderful news of Christ's rising from the dead to one Sunday. In the mind of the Church, every Sunday is like a little Easter.

The resurrection of Christ meant so much to the first Christians that they went so far as to change the Sabbath to Sunday to emphasize the resurrection – they went against the Jewish law "Keep holy the Sabbath." They didn't change the Sabbath to Good Friday to commemorate the death of Our Lord, to celebrate the anniversary of his death.

Easter means everything to a Christian. Easter means that Jesus is God. His death on Calvary proves that he was really human. His resurrection proves that he is really divine. Christ rising from death proves that he was, as he claimed to be, the Son of God.

Easter means that Christ's words are not empty promises when he says: "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though he should die, will come to life" (John 11:25-26).

Easter means that my faith is not in vain, for the founder and foundation of my faith is Jesus Christ, who rose up from the dead. Easter means that my life makes sense, that my life is not a tale told by an idiot. Easter means that life is worth living and even death is worth dying. # From Pastors Pen



Dear Friends,

Isn't it funny how easily we get distracted from prayer. Last week I invited you to memorize the prayer Jesus prayed on the cross: "Lord, into your hands I commit my spirit." I invited you to pray it daily, to pray it when all is going well and to pray it when you're going through a rough patch. It reminds us that God loves us and wants us to live fully, and that's something we can only do if we, as the rules of Methodism tell us, "stay in love with God."

I also like this little pray because it's a breath prayer, a prayer you can say in one breath. You can say this prayer anywhere, while you're driving, at work, while you cook. This takes away the excuse that I'm too busy to pray. I know I often let my "busyness" keep me from taking time to talk to the Lord. Has that ever happened to you?

I think all of us are challenged by our busy lives, without meaning to, we often allow our spiritual lives to be pushed aside by all the things we have to do. I have to take care of my children, be prepared for work, help at school, care for my loved ones, how could I possibly have time for prayer? I think we are mistaken when we allow this to happen. Prayer is such a wonderful thing. It allows us to talk to and be guided by the Lord of Lords and the King of Kings. Then why don't we pray?

Leonard Sweet says, "The greatest longing in the heart of God is to talk to his children. Then why don't we pray? Nothing is impossible to those who pray. Then why don't we pray? Every sin is forgiven, every stain is washed clean, all guilt diminished to those who pray. Then why don't we pray? Everyone can pray, the young, the old, the rich, the poor, the strong, the weak, the sinner, the prisoner, in any nation, in any language, all can pray. Then why don't we pray?"

Ever wonder about the acronym ASAP? Generally we think of it in terms of even more hurry and stress in our lives: "AS Soon As Possible." Maybe if we think of this abbreviation in a different manner, we'll begin to find a new way to deal with those rough days along the way.

There's work to do, deadlines to meet, you've got no time to spare, but as you hurry and scurry, ASAP: "Always Say A Prayer." In the midst of family hustle and bustle, quality time is rare. Do your best; let God do the rest, ASAP: "Always Say A Prayer." It may seem like your worries are more than you can bear. Slow down and take a breather, ASAP: "Always Say A Prayer." God knows how stressful life is, he wants to ease our cares, and he'll respond to all our needs, ASAP: "Always Say A Prayer."

# Q&A

### ENDOWMENTS/LEGACY GIFTS

#### Q: Endowments aka Legacy Gifts! What are they?

A: Gifts from the Past, Investments to Blast us into the Future!!

#### Q: But what are they??

A: Gifts to the church to provide Long Term funding for FUMC ministries through investments.

#### Q: But what are they?

A: Well they're like savings accounts at the United Methodist Foundation, earnings from the investments are used for doing ministry like Feed Dat or Mission projects or Bible Studies.

#### Q: Can you be more specific?

A: Sure. Some funds target high priority Children and Youth spiritual development programs. For instance, there's the 3rd Grade Bible Fund which was established by Elementary School teacher Ms. Emily Magee, to make sure 3rd Graders would always receive their very own Bible.

#### Q: Now you're talking! What else are they?

A: Well, for the Youth program, there is the Mayfield Youth Fund which provides funds for Crossroads ministry and mission trips like going to Big Stuff or TeamEffort Mission Trip and other fun places like Dollywood in TN.

There's also the Buster & Lois Baker Memorial fund and the Dyer Family fund which provides annual funding for the Confirmation Class, Youth and Children's programs including field trips to events at the Conference Center with the Bishop and bunches of other kids. Children's Ministry activities like Sunday School, Drama Camp and VBS in the summer also benefit.

And the FUMC Preschool also has an investment account to cover unexpected needs should they arise. That provides peace of mind for all the teachers and parents of the children attending preschool, knowing that their children are well cared for and having fun learning things.

### Q: Sounds like plenty of kid's ministries are taken care of. Is there anything for older, grown-up people?

A: Sure! Lots!! Besides Feed Dat! There's Fix Dat! There's Pumpkin Patch! Seasonal Advent and Lent Bible Studies, Sunday morning Adult Sunday School Classes, Disaster Relief projects, Summertime Wednesday Summer Nights dinner and study events. But wait! Theres more!!

Looking for your best new ministry idea? The JK Sunny Day fund is a Kick Starter Fund to help you start a new ministry to serve our local community. The people served by Feed Dat will tell you it works with a Big Thank You!! But wait! Theres more!!

The Campus Maintenance, Trustee's Fund and the Organ Console funds provide funds for facility repairs and upkeep. These ministry areas need capable young men and women to manage construction /rehab projects. The Organ Console upgrade and rehab project is Kicking Off. Will you be an Organ Donor?

#### Q: You mean, I can be an Organ Donor?

A: Yes! Anyone can make a gift to these Endowments, Sometimes, they are called legacy funds, especially if they are established as a memorial or "in honor of" fund. Examples are the Mayfield Youth Fund, The Buster & Lois Baker Memorial Fund, The Dyer Family Fund, The JK Sunny Day Fund, and the Richard & Marilyn Jeppesen Fund. Some funds are general purpose, like the Campus Maintenance fund, Specials, Budget Support, Preschool, 3rd Grade Bible and the Organ Console funds established by many gifts from church members over the years.

One last thing. Maybe two. Our Church, meaning, We Are the Church, is over 135 years old.

### Q: Aren't you happy to be a part of a church family with an investment time horizon of another 135 years or more?

A: Yes!! It's wonderful we are Blessed with Legacy Endowments!!










## DISCIPLESHIP

# United Methodist News



Now is the time to embark on a journey of spiritual leadership with Lay Servant Ministry courses, offered by Lay Servant Ministries and the Board of Laity of The Louisiana Conference.

Whether it's the Introduction to Lay Ministry course, where you'll discover your gifts which can lead to effective leadership in your community or Leading Worship, an offering for those called to guide worship, you'll be ready to pioneer HōPE in your community.

#### **Course Descriptions**

#### Introduction to Lay Ministry (Basic Course)

This is a foundational course recommended for every person involved in any lay ministry or holding a leadership position. Participants use scripture and engage in exercises designed to help them understand and employ their gifts, learn about servant leadership and developing future leaders, and discuss concepts of Christian conferencing and decision making and the importance of remaining rooted in consistent spiritual practices.

Prior to attending, participants must purchase and complete Lay Servant Ministries Basic Course Participant's Book

#### Lay Servants as Christian Transformational Leaders (Advanced Course)

This course is recommended for people who lead in lay ministries in or outside of the church or who hold leadership positions. The United Methodist Church needs Christian Transformational leaders to accomplish its stated mission of making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. In this course, we will explore scriptural foundations of Christian transformational leadership, develop principles and skills for organizational effectiveness, and learn how to lead movements of hope in our congregations and communities. *Prior to attending, participants must purchase and read Lay Servant as Christian Transformational Leaders* 

#### Leading Worship (Advanced Course)

This course is recommended for people who regularly or who may be called on occasionally to lead a group or congregation in Worship. It is also one of the required courses for those individuals who wish to receive certification as a Certified Lay Speaker. The materials used in this course are written for use by both pastors and lay worship leaders. Whether you lead worship every week or just want to be able to assist or fill in when your pastor is out, this course covers the fundamentals of Christian worship as well as how to use United Methodist resources to plan and execute engaging worship.

Prior to attending, participants must purchase and read "Worshiping with United Methodists"


**Locations & Details**
